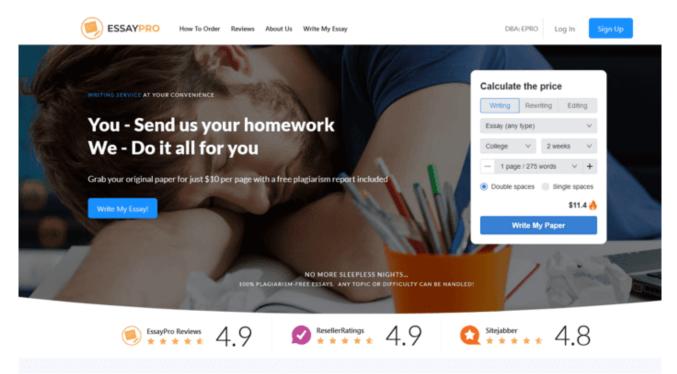
Technology in Education
