Franklin then followed Cust to the cinema, committed the last murder, and planted the knife on him as he left. Murders is a work of detective fiction by British writer Agatha Christie, featuring her characters Hercule Poirot, Arthur Hastings and Chief Inspector Japp, as they contend with a series of killings by a mysterious murderer known only as "A.B.C.". The UK serialisation was in sixteen parts in the Daily Express from Monday 28 November to Thursday 12 December 1935.
